Submissions are welcome covering all periods and geographies of the long Middle Ages as well as medievalisms from literature and popular culture. Some ideas that might be considered (but not limited to) are:

- Ideals, practices, and rituals of teaching and learning
- Gendered approaches to learning and gender in learning
- The monarchical/princely household as a primary locus of teaching and learning
- Inter-generational teaching and learning
- Teaching that to govern is to serve
- Oral transmission, practice, and performance in learning processes – learning by observation
- Networks of teaching and learning
- "Home-made", commissioned, and unsolicited conduct books and teaching materials and commentaries
